Construction of Rain Garden at the JC Hormel Nature Center



A rain garden is a garden with a depression that is designed to catch rainwater runoff. Rain gardens soak up rain where it falls. They slow storm water runoff and filters pollutants in the process. This rain garden treats the water coming off the Nature Center parking lot.

This demonstration site for a rain garden had several partners that helped with the funding. CRWD, JC Hormel Nature Center, Friends of the Nature Center, City of Austin, Mower County, CRWD Board of Managers, Bustad Excavating and Hansen Excavating.
